

JENNISON ROAD

11A First House on the right may have been built by Horatio

N. Dunbar who came to Milford in 1845 and removed to Lunenburg, Mass in 1874. May of 1854 gives him as owner.

Albert E. Carleton, who came to Milford in 1870, and resided first on the place formerly owned by Tyler Tone owned this place. Later his son Chester V. Carleton was the owner. He died in 1959 and in 1963 his son Clarence Carleton sold to Aquiline and Jeanne Grugnali. Grugnalis were the owners January 1974.

JENNISON ROAD

100
Next house on the left (opposite Joslin Road). This house was settled by William Wallace, who emigrated with his father, Joseph, from Londonderry, Ireland about 1726. He was 5 years old moved to Amherst 1752. His home was "near the residence of the late David Hutchinson, on the old Mont Vernon Road" (now Jennison) At the time of his settlement "before 1755" this land was part of Souhegan West of the township of Amherst. The farm was later owned by his son John Wallace. Probably David purchased it about 1835 when John Wallace died. The map of 1854 gives him as owner, also the directory of 1873.

It looks as though the present house was made up by joining two separate houses - one built several years before the other. The maps of 1892 and 1901 give George Armstrong as owner.

1913 Taxed to George Armstrong. (85 acres)

1927 Taxed to Mrs. Annie Duke (88 acres)

1937 Taxed to Mrs. Mabel Carlander. Has had several owners since

By 1955 owned by Harold + Roberta Toomey , owners 1974.

Next House on the right is the Aladon Averill house,

JENNISON ROAD

157²

Just off this road to the right on a private road was settled by EbenezerAverill in 1752. This was part of a King's Grant. His house was built in 1786. For more information see Early Milford Homes. Present owner Mrs. Charles D. Perkins who purchased in 1944 and is owner January 1974.

No. 176

Next house on the left from the Carters is the house of John Ulricson which was built by his father in 1914.

JENNISON ROAD

The first house on this site was owned by George

Hartson and sold to Herman H. Parker before 1888.

Around 1908 the house occupied by Hermon H. Parker was struck by lightning and burned.

Sometime before 1952 George Ames built the next house
on the right.

1966 John Simo built the 2 story garrison type.

Other house on the left built in the 1960s.

JENNISON ROAD

In 1962 Gilbert T. Riley sold land to Roger S. Reynolds who built a 3 bedroom house and garage.

JOHNSON STREET

This street was surveyed in 1896. The directory of 1873 gives four different people as living "off Cottage". They were A.W. Steele, tinman, Mrs. Rodney Tapley, William Wellman, butcher and W.E. Alexander, engineer. None of these are mentioned in the Milford Town History. The Directory of 1895 gives William Keith "off West".

From the Farmers Cabinet I found this item."In 1892 Will Keith purchased the old slaughter house and later used it for a soap factory. At that time he was listed as living at No.4 Knight St. (now No.4 Johnson) Could that have been the slaughter barn that William Wellman, Butcher was using in 1873 and did he live at No.4? Only research can answer.

The tax inventory of April 1, 1913 gives Patrick Fitzpatrick, Thomas Fitzpatrick, William Keith homestead and cottage, NO. 4

and soap factory, Jerry Gogan, Frederick Rocca, off Johnson,
Michael Ryan, Charles Serio, Anthony Villane and James Works.

JOHNSON STREET

No. 5 (old #5) This is a pre-fab house built about 1955 by
Floyd Burnap. In October 1965 Gilbert Russell sold to
Ernest + Elizabeth La Pointe, owners 1974. They built an
addition to the house.

JOHNSON STREET

No.6 (old #4) This is the oldest house on the street. Research is needed to find the first owner. William Keith was living here by 1892. April 1932 he had the ell of the house reconstructed and additional rooms added. There had been a fire there a short time before. This cottage was sold Dec 1942 to Donald McCormack who in 1951 built on added rooms, using lumber from the old soap factory.

Owned 1967 by James Smith. Present owner 1974 is Roland Sprague.

JOHNSON STREET

(old #7) This is on the 1901 map. Was first owned by

Charles Serio and probably built for him. Joseph Marcheth was first taxed for it in 1927.

1937 Owned by Doris Murphy.

By 1952 owned by Robert M + Pauline Peaslee.

Owner 1974 Mrs. Pauline Peaslee

JOHNSON STREET

No. 14 (old #10) PERmit to Edward Thane to build July 1952 a 1½story
cape. Owner in 1974.

JOHNSON STREET

NO. 15 (old #9) ON 1901 Map.

Built for Anthony Villani.

1927 Owned by Bernard Ryan and Mrs. Mary Ryan.

1943 Webster Harley owned.

1947 Kenneth + Lillian Bly owned the Harley house.

1951 Gordon Townsend purchased and is owner in 1974.

JOHNSON STREET

(old # 12) Built 1899-1900 by William Keith. Owned by members of his family for a long time.

Owned since 1943 by his daughter, Miss Bernice Keith.

June 16, 1980 owned by Bernard and Priscilla Harding. Mrs. Harding is the grand daughter of William Keith.

JOHNSON STREET

No.20 (old #16) Built in 1897 for Jerry Gogan.

1974 Owned by his sons James and John Gogan

JOHNSON STREET

No.23 (old #15)

This is given in Nov. 1923 as Ablion Falla's new house.

1928 Purchased by Rosario Granata.

1974 Owned by his heirs.

JOHNSON STREET

No. 24 (old #24) Built in 1897.

1913 Taxed to Michael Ryan. Mrs. Michael Ryan sold.

1929 Fournier place sold to Alex Salo. Alex Salo lived hereuntil 194

1943 Robert Sanborn taxed for the "Fournier place"

1947, 1952, 1957 Robert and Irene Sanborn taxed for the Salo house.

By 1966 owned by Dalton Jewett, owner 1974.

JOHNSON STREET

No. 26 (old #20)

1913 Owned by Thomas Fitzpatrick.

1922 Gordon Wark owned the Fitzpatrick house which he owned until 1947

1951 Charles Zahn purchased and sold in 1967 to Eugene and Beverly
Whittemore, owners 1974. This house needs research back of 1913.

It may have been one of the houses built by Samuel Johnson
before 1900, but was not on the maps of 1892 or 1901.

JOHNSON STREET

(old # 21) Thomas Winters, carpenter, built this place for James Wark and he was taxed for it from 1913 through 1927.

April 1937 He sold to William Brunelle who owned through 1952.

1957 It was taxed to Edward + Ruth Hardy.

1967 Taxed to Lester G.+ Edna B. McCassey who sold to RAndell Rossen, owner 1974.

JOHNSON STREET

NO. 29 (old #17) Built before 1900

1913 Owned by Philip Rocca.

1972 By Mrs Elizabeth Rocca

JOHNSON STREET

No.30 (old #22) In 1913 this was taxed to Patrick Fitzpatrick but Bernice Keith says that there was a family named Dube who lived there earlier, and she thinks it was an older house. It is not on the 1892 or 1901 map.

1922 It was taxed to Michael Fitzpatrick.

1913 Louis Trow purchased the Mahar place.

July 1952 Permit for Mrs. Mabel Trow to add a porch. She is the daughter-in-law of Louis Trow, and owner 1974.

JOSLIN ROAD

First house on the left from Jennison Road.

This was settled by Capt. Andres Bradford in 1743 who married a daughter of Col. John Goffe for his second wife. This was in the part of Amherst known as Souhegan West. He bought the right of John Bowtel of Reading MA, also the right of John Farrington of Lynn MA to lot NO.22 and to lot 110 in Souhegan West. These were grants made to soldiers who took part in King Phillip's War.

This house was owned by his son Capt. John Bradford until 1800.

Luther Averill owned until his death in 1864. Map of 1854 gives Luther Averill. His cousin Helen Averill married J. Fitch Crosby.

Mapes of 1892 and 1901 give J. Fitch Crosby.

By 1913 it was owned by Otis Joslin and after his death by his son

Charles Porter Joslin, owner Jan 1974.

This house still has many of its original features and has been modernized only as to electricity and oil heat.

JOSLIN ROAD

No. 11
Second house on the left.

This was probably built by Joseph Wallace who married in 1779 and died in 1838. Map of 1854 gives Taylor as owner. Before that 1846 Abel Hutchinson, son of Nathan reside there for a short time. 1872 The farm was purchased by Nathaniel Pierce (100 acre farm) 1902 N. Pierce was 80 years old, but still cared for 20 head of cattle, several horses and 200 hens. May 1911 His place as sold at auction for \$4000 and bought by Mrs. A.L. Curtis of Wilton. Ever since that date the farm has belonged to a Curtis (Clintina E. and present owner (1974) Charles F. Curtis.

Joslin Road

The next house on the left.

This was first a camp (Luke Duffy) moved there from the Mont VERNON Road. Charles Curtis added to it to make a house for his hired man. Later he traded it with his Aunt Clintina for the big house.

1974 It is the home of Frederick and Vurlyne Curtis who in 1964 were given a permit to raise the roof and add dormer windows in the front.

JOSLIN ROAD

The house on the right was a camp - added to by moving a building from the golf links in Mont Vernon by Lena Destroismaison and in 1954 she sold to Harold H. Hutchinson. He owned 1974
