Mother's Day!

We will read *T-Rex and the Mother's Day Hug* by Lois G. Grambling and illustrated by Jack E. Davis. Mother's Day is here, and T. Rex wants to plan something extra special for his mama. He really wants to do something instead of just giving something. T. Rex is sure he has a perfect gift idea, but will Mama Rex love it, too? We will also read *The Night Before Mother's Day* by Natasha Wing. It's the night before Mother's Day, and Dad and the kids are determined to show Mom just how much they love her. They whip up a cake from scratch, and offer a special coupon for a day at the spa, right in their own kitchen! Kids and moms will love reading this sweet story aloud together for a fun way to celebrate Mother's Day. We will have a craft.

May 12th

Mo Willems Pigeon Books

We will read and watch *Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus!* by Mo Willems. No matter how hard he pleads and begs, the pigeon is not supposed to drive the bus while the driver is away but pigeon tries every trick a young child knows to get you to say, "Yes". We will also read *Pigeon Finds a Hot Dog!* by Mo Willems. Pigeon learns about sharing when a curious duckling keeps asking questions about the hot dog Pigeon has found. We will also watch *Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the bus!*

May 19th

We will read *Everything is Mama!* by Jimmy Fallon and illustrated by Miguel Ordóñez. A lot of babies' first words are DADA. However, everything after that was MAMA. So take a lighthearted look at the world from your baby's point of view as different animals try to teach their children that there are other words in addition to MAMA for familiar objects and activities. We will also read *Hands Up!* By Breanna J McDaniel and illustrated by Shane W. Evans. A young Black girl lifts her baby hands up to greet the sun, reaches her hands up for a book on a high shelf, and raises her hands up in praise at a church service. She stretches her hands up high like a plane's wings and whizzes down a hill so fast on her bike with her hands way up. As she grows, she lives through everyday moments of joy, love, and sadness.

May 26th

We will read *If You Give a Pig a Pancake* by Laura Numeroff and Illustrated by Felicia Bond. If you give a pig a pancake, she'll want some syrup to go with it. You'll give her some of your favorite maple syrup, and she'll probably get all sticky, so she'll want to take a bath. She'll ask you for some bubbles. When you give her the bubbles...Readers will delight in the story of an accommodating little girl who tries to keep up with the whims of a busy little pig. We will also read *How to Trick the Tooth Fairy* by Erin Danielle Russell. Kaylee loves pulling pranks: from dropping water balloons on passersby to even tricking Santa Claus, she's a prize-winning prankster! But is she the Princess of Pranks? No! That title is held by none other than the Tooth Fairy. We will have a craft.
