PROGRAM TITLE: Altered Books Craft

BRIEF PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Recycle old books and transform them into works of art. Participants can collage, rip, color, draw, glue, and sew in the books.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

*Hardcover books. We used discarded books from our collection. Choose short books so that participants can get more done.

*Markers, pens, and pencils.

*A variety of decorative and colored paper

and tissue paper.

*Sequins. *Ribbon.

*Xacto knife.

*Old magazines for collaging.

*A hole puncher (single).

*A hair dryer for drying glue and paint.

*Stickers.

COST:

About \$20 to 25 for craft supplies, depending on how much you already have.

PROGRAM PROCEDURE:

- *Present information on altered books, pictures of altered books, and one or more samples.
- *Participants choose a book.
- *Using the materials provided, participants get creative with their books.
- *Participants should rip out 5-10 pages in between altered pages to make room for the altered pages.
- *It's useful to dry pages with a hairdryer once they're finished, so that participants can move on to another page without ruining their work.

The program was scheduled for an hour and half, but could have easily run for two hours. In an hour and a half, most participants didn't finish their books, but got a very good start. This would be a good program to do in two segments, or else participants can finish at home.
