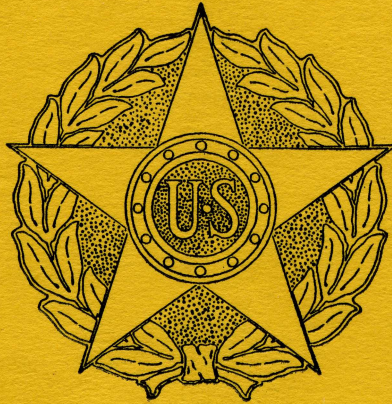

The house on the George S. Stone Estate, site of the Southbridge World War Memorial Park, was built in 1813 by Dr. Reuben Harrington.

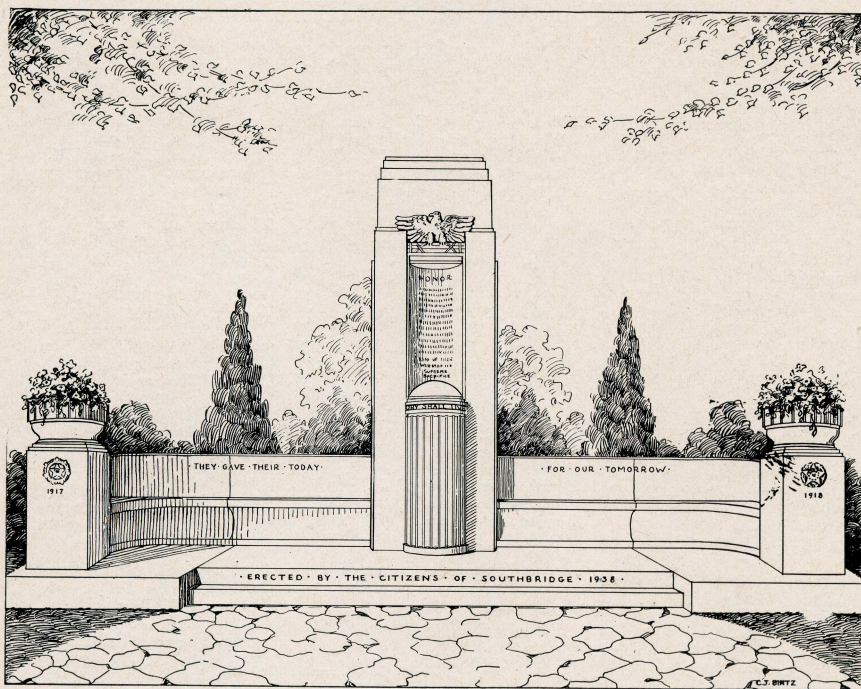
Material for this house was standing in the forest 90 days before actual building began.

“THE BIG ELM” pride of Southbridge, standing at the southeast corner of the Fire Headquarters, was planted in 1765 by Mrs. Freeman, grandmother of Mrs. Luther Ammidown.

About 1860 George S. Stone bought this property when he opened a blacksmith shop and he later added a carriage shop which Mr. Stone continued to operate for about 40 years.

At one time this was the leading blacksmith shop in Southbridge and much activity was seen at this spot.

On recommendation of the World War Memorial Committee the citizens of Southbridge voted, on March 14th 1938, to purchase this property for the sum of \$18,500.00, create a park and insure a fitting location for a World War Veterans Monument.



In 1924 The Massachusetts State Legislature passed a bill to refund, Cities and Towns, the excess Poll Tax assessed against the inhabitants of the Commonwealth for the payment of the Soldiers' Bonuses. The sum of \$7,-770.25 was the share returned to Southbridge.

At the 1925 Annual Town Meeting the citizens unanimously voted to transfer this amount to the World War Memorial Fund (created at that time) and that the principal and accrued interest would be used whenever the American Legion, in conjunction with the Town, should decide upon a memorial.

At the beginning of 1938 the Commander of the American Legion appointed a World War Memorial Committee who voted to recommend the purchase of the Stone property on Elm St. and erect a memorial in the form of a monument in honor of those who served in the World War.

The citizens of Southbridge, in Town Meeting, held March 14th 1938 voted, unanimously, to accept The Memorial Committee recommendation and to transfer the World War Memorial Fund (now \$12,469.25) to the World War Memorial Committee.

The Committee awarded the contract for the monument to M. D. Morrill & Son of Southbridge, at a price of \$10,000.00. This monument, made of Rock of Ages granite, is 23½ feet long with a 14 foot center shaft on which is inscribed the names of those who made the supreme sacrifice.

The World War Memorial Park, a beautiful setting for the memorial itself, is the first Public Park to be established in Southbridge, a fitting tribute to its veterans.

The Southbridge Woman's Club was very active, cooperating with the Town Committee in raising money for the Belgian Relief; made garments for French and Italian children; bought Liberty Bonds and many members solicited, from house to house, purchasers of Liberty Bonds and War Savings Stamps.

In 1916 the Club contributed to the Serbian Relief and the YMCA War Fund. One of the largest undertakings of the Club was the demonstration of proper canning of foods in various sections of the town. The Club paid \$36.50 for 3 years (the quota asked) towards the support of a French Orphan.

In January 1915 the work of making surgical dressings was started and continued under Club Management until the last few months of the War, when the Red Cross took it over, Club members continuing in this work. In May 1915, about 3900 dressings, of different kinds, had been made and the work grew in volume as the years went on.

The activities of the Woman's Club will long be remembered.

The Southbridge Safety Committee sent Xmas Boxes to the Boys in Camp.

Two Companies of State Guards were organized and were in active drill.

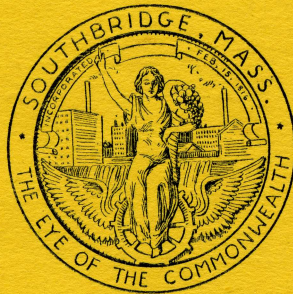
