The matter of vandalism and defacing library property was discussed. It was decided for the present no one was to be prosecuted but restitution was to be made for the damage already done, and an article was to be put in the local paper explaining the future policy of the trustees in such cases.

Second-

Miss Bamford is to handle accounts under Mrs.Smith's approval until Miss Miersch's return. She is also to buy books as needed after submitting book lists to Mr. Wells.

Third-

After an explanation of the status of Library employers, it was voted to fix the rate of pay the same as was voted at town meeting, namely a ten percent cut for the current year for all town workers.

The meeting was then adjourned.

LIBRARY TO DRIVE Against vandals

Trustees of Jacob Edwards Memorial library will conduct a campaign against vandals who deface and destroy books and other property at the public institution, they announced today.

A case has been brought to the attention of the trustees wherein a local resident cut pages from a valuable book owned by the library. The case was investigated by the board and the person admitted his guilt, agreeing to make restitution for the cost of the book.

In the future, however, the trustees promised to prosecute vandals to the full extent of the law, requiring at the same time payment for the book or magazine damaged and subjecting the person to exclusion from the library.
