Voted- To ask Mr. Austin to suggest an expert to look over the building and make out specifications for painting the inside of the building in the summer of 1937. To offer the specifications to Town painters for bids, and

include the cost of painting in the budget for 1937.

October 14, 1936.

Present Mrs. Smith and Mr. Montague.

Voted- To order the periodicals and newspapers for 1937 from Foley's News, as always - to add periodicals suggested to take the place of other periodicals which had changed their character, or been suspended.

Discussed the question of Library borrowers who lived out of Town, but owned property in Town.
