Because they work during the day, not many Southbridge people are able to drop into Jacob Edwards Memorial library in the afternoon when the place is invaded by children about the age of the ones who cause Dagwood of the comics so much trouble.

There is no influx of adults which compares in numbers to the crowds of children who patronize the library. The ones we refer to are of grammar school age and few of them have school assignments to force them to use the library. The children come because they like to, because they find there the books they like, and because they are made welcome by the staff and are given understanding and friendly treatment.

Miss Elaine Van Nostrand, the librarian, deserves a vote of thanks for the hard work and imagination she has displayed. Her hope for a separate children's section more than deserves the serious consideration of the townspeople.

November meeting 1946 was held with all trustees present except Mr. Kay and Mr. Pioppi.

Minutes were read of the previous meeting followed by the treasurer's report and both were accepted.

A new account was opened in the Savings Bank to be known as the Equipment Fund and \$2000. was deposited.

Mr. Crawford reported that the Southbridge Improvement Committee set up the amount of \$48000 for 1948. This is for a new Children's room for the library.

The 1947 budget is asked for by the finance committee.

Miss Van Nostrand talked of prospects of a reference librarian. She is asked to get salary data from Division of Public Libraries in Boston.

The Southbridge Finishing Company wants to give the library a Memorial Book in memory of Mr. David Hobson.

A record for the library was made last month 600 childrens books dispersed in one day. This was due to the stimulus furnished by the talks in the schools by Miss Van Nostrand and Miss Demarais.
