

BALL HILL ROAD

1800 - First house on right, now torn down, was settled by Jonathan Ball who died 1829. He was a Revolutionary War soldier. Briggs Ball, his son, lived on the farm and d. 1868. Thomas Ball, the eminent sculptor, born in Boston, was a grandson of Jonathan.

1797 (Has date of building on cellar wall.) The first house on the left from Melendy Road was built by David Woolson who d. 1834. His son David Jr. resided here and d. 1858. Maps of 1892 and 1901 give James Sanderson as owner. Next owner, his son, Clarence C. who married 1898 and d. Oct 1913. Dean Moore, guardian of Isaac Woolson Estate. David Woolson to William and James Sanderson. Vol.329 P.497 April 1860.

1921 Estate of Clarence E. Sanderson sold to Thure Wuon, who is 1926 sold to Standley Ellis. Taxed in 1932 to Mrs. William Ellis.

There were several other owners.

1955 Fred Annand purchased, still owns Dec. 1973.

BALL HILL ROAD

Map of 1854 gives two houses next to the Brookline line. Maps of 1892 and 1901 have no houses on left side of road. A.H. Emery came to Milford and owned a house on the right side of the road and Levi H. Putnam who came in 1880 owned the last house on the right next to the Brookline line. In 1915 Leroy Putnam's house burned. No. 228 In 1937 the S.H. Emery house was owned by Ruby Hanton and in 1939 she and two men were arrested for burning her house. By 1947 Charles F. and Eva Bailey owned the Hanton place and built a new house. # 228

By 1952 Charles Bailey Jr. built next to his father's. Both own their own home. # 212

No. 194 By 1913 Harry W. Melendy owned a house on the right above the Annand place.

By 1943 Harry F. Melendy owned the Melendy house which he still owned Dec. 1973.

BALL HILL ROAD

No. 207 In 1927 Addie Barnard owned a small house near the
Melendy place.

In 1943 Hazel Beardsley owned the Barnard house. George Beardsley
owns 1996.

BEECH STREET

This was once a part of Dean Moore farm until 1890 when Hartshorn cut up that farm into house lots and sold them. This street was called East Union until sometime after 1940.

(old #2) This was built by Arthur Winslow who in 1890 added an ell and in 1897 added a barn. It was owned by 1913 by Mrs. Harriet Whitehead, also 1927, 37 and 40. In 1947 taxed to Theodore & Helena A Rejimbak. Sold 1970-71 by Theodore Rejimbak to John Somolski. Directory of 1973 rented ? Lawrence Platte/Darrell W. Jeffreys.

BEECH STREET

(old #5) Built in 1890 by Calvin Merrill.

BEECH STREET

(old #6) Map of 1892 gives E. or F. Clark. This might have been Elmer Clark who came to Milford in 1890.

1901 map gives A.W. Merrill.

1913 Taxed to Harriet E. Fay, but Archie Gordon lived here in 1913 and through 1947.

1952 taxed to Joseph & Effie Tucker, owners through 1972.

Sold to Paul s. Dimick (Directory 1973)

BEECH STREET

No. 9 (old #7) Built in 1890 by Calvin Merrill.

1927 taxed to his daughter Mrs. Hattie E. Ware.

1938 her estate was sold to Owen Fisk and taxed to him in 1942 + 194

1952, 1957, 1962 taxed to Wallace + Beverly Stitham.

1965 they sold to Donald R. and Janet E. Fifield.

1974 they have sold to Paul Porter.

BEECH STREET

No. 15 (old # 9) Paul Porter bought the lot from Daisy and Gladys Burns in 1954 and built the house in 1957. He still owns in 1974.

BEECH STREET

No. 17 (old #11) Origene Vigneault bought the land and poultry houses by 1942 and made a house from the grain house.

1946 this was purchased by Raymond Wright who built an addition on in 1946 and another addition on the back in 1952. He is the owner in 1974.

BEECH STREET

No. 18 (old #10) John Bellew bought the Dr. Charles Weaver lot and built the house about 1950. He is the owner 1974.

BEECH STREET

No. 22 (old # 12) Built by S.E. JOHNSON about 1897. Given on
1901 map as J.H. Fay, who rented.

1813 owned by Louis Calderara

1962 taxed to his daughters Ermina and Josephine Calderara,
owners 1974.

BEECH STREET

No. 23 (old #13) Built by Louis Works on land bought from Charles Scully. (This land was part of the Willis Burns poultry plant which he had sold to Works. Built before 1957 and he is the owner in 1974.)

BEECH STREET

No. 26 (old #14) Built by S.E.Johnson before 1897 and sold that year to John Stickney who rented it to people.

1927 taxed to John J. & Roseanne McCormick, also 1937.

Nov. 1940 Mr. & Mrs. Charles Scully moved into the former McCormick house.

1969 owned by Mrs. Charles (Olga E.) Scully, owner 1974.

BEECH STREET

Beginning in 1959 Kokko Builders made an extension of Beech Street through the former Clay's Woods, a former picnic grove.

1962 there were 4 houses built on the left side and 5 on the right.

No. 36 (old #16) (old #18) and 2 others built in 1960.

1961 old #s 22, 25, 24, 29 were built.

1962 old #s 26 + 31 were built.

All others since that date.

BERRY COURT

This is not on any map of early Milford.

1897 Smith Berry built two cottages on Berry Court.

Smith Berry was not taxed for his two cottages in 1913.

Feb 1916 William Hutchinson built a cottage for Smith Berry and that was the house he was taxed for in 1922 (house and land Berry Court \$2000 value. He had sold by 1927.

BERRY COURT

1921 Eliza Leonard sold house to Emory Duffy.

1922 Luke Duffy advertised if for sale. Deed of William + Elizabeth
Leonard to Emory L. Duffy Feb 13, 1922 Vol. 808.

1913 John Baum owned. John Baum house taxed at \$900 value.

1940 J. William Johnson owned no. 8.

1954 Ray and Lois Emery sold to Joseph V. + Enis Sullivan.

Owners in 1973.

No. 12 (old #10)

1913 Mrs. Ellen Conley owned. Ellen Conley house taxed to \$800.

1940 Francil Conley owned.

1954 Helen B. Conley to Annie I + Alice L. Emery land and buildings

No. 11 (old #3) This was Dr. Herbert Hutchinson's garage for his house on Myrtle Street.

1954 Kenneth Holt bought the garage and made it into a dwelling house.

1962 Taxed to Mrs. Barbara Hiltz. She is the owner 1974.

1991 Owner Katherine H. Bauer.

BILLINGS STREET

No. 16 (old #4) was built in 1895 by Charles Wilkins who sold in 1907 to Dr. W.H. Hinds.

Oct 1942 sold to Leland Kidder by Dr. W.H. Hinds. L. Kidder sold in 1959.

1962 taxed to E. Wilson + Nilah K. Lincoln who bought it from Mr. Broughton.

1974 owned by Mrs. Nilah K. Lincoln.

BILLINGS STREET

No. 21 (old #9) Built by Willis Parker in 1903.

Nov. 1951 purchased by Mr. + Mrs. Fecteau.

1957 through 1967 taxed to Frank Yeaw.

1967 taxed to Michael Cullihan.

1972 sold to John Miller.

1977 sold to Joel Chappell.

BORDER STREET

Not on the map of 1854. Map of 1892 ---

From Souhegan Street to Amherst line.

Halfway up on the left T. Connell

Patrick Doyle almost to the Amherst Line.

BORDER STREET

Map of 1892 from Souhegan St. north to the Amherst line.

1st house on the right was J. O'Hara (corner of Border + Souhegan)

The names of M. Millen and P. Dillon are given, but not the location of their house. Map of 1901 give the same names.

1895 Directory gives Thomas Connell, Patrick O.B.Dillon Patrick Doyle And Thomas Mullen.

BURNS ROAD

No. 18

There is only one house on this road. This is the house built by Daniel Burns in 1817. For information about this house see "Early Milford Homes."

the original John Burns house was moved from its position near Burns Rock to a site on the Daniel Burns farm located a short distance north west of the Daniel Burns house. In 1898 when carpenters were repairing this old house they found bricks dated 1786. It was used as adwelling house at first but in 1898 was being repaired for a stable. Both the Burns Assoc. and the Historical Society have a picture of the old house.
