1924 Tonella & Sons erected a stone office east of French + Heald factory (now Edgewood Shopping).

1973 This was taken over by the firm which had bought out the People's Laundry and used it for a laundry. That was unfortunate in some ways as the interior had beautiful panelling. Sept 1949 Tolvo Petersen was given a permit to build a one room

dwelling off Tonella Road \$100. The next January he added a second room.

1967 A camp was taxed to his heirs.

No. 5Next on road toward the old quarry was Lawrence Jarest, first taxed in 1957. 1966 Added lean-to roof

1967 Lawrence Jarest owned.

No. 41 Lawrence Wright taxed in 1952 and is owner 1975.

Directory of 1895 gives this as Burns Court. The three houses in the Court may have been built by George W. Burns who lived at No. 12 (old number) Souhegan St.
1892 and 1901 maps give Trows Court and the three houses were owned by J.P. Trow. In 1913 Clarence Trow owned 1,2,3 Trows Court and No. 7 (old number) Pleasant.
1947 He had sold No. 3 to Francis Golden
1952 He had sold all houses
