

Media Selection

The Library will adhere to the tenets of the Library Bill of Rights, and the Freedom to Read Statement adopted by the American Library Association. See Appendix C in the *Wilton Public And Gregg Free Library Policy Manual Approved By Board Of Trustees*.

The Library Director and staff shall, with such suggestions as may be given them by the Board of Trustees and Library patrons, make such media selections as shall be deemed to meet the public demands and requirements, order the same, and put them into circulation. Library materials will be selected according to procedures of the Library profession: timeliness, accuracy, and varied viewpoints.

The Citizen's Request for Reconsideration form is available at the circulation desk. Patrons use this form to list their objections to material, programs, events, or displays. The Board of Trustees will read the form and make a decision as to whether the material is retained or removed from the collection or whether the program, event, or display will be offered or continue to be offered. The complaint will be heard at the next regular board meeting. The decision will be given in writing after the board has had the opportunity to review the material. The decision of the trustees is final. Gifts of books shall be treated in a like manner.
